CAMP PENDLETON MONTHLY MATCHES

Registration: Registration starts at Range 103 (Wilcox), 0700 in front of the range office and will be complete NLT 7:30 AM and firing will begin NLT 7:45 AM. All competitors must pre-register NLT Wednesday prior to any rifle practice and or Match. Santa Margarita has to provide a competitors list to Base Access Manager, Marine Corps Base on later than 72 hours prior to any event. All entries can be sent via post and or email.

Match Rules: Across the course; Service Rifle- Rule 3.1, 3.3.1 or 3.1.2; NRA Match Rifle, Rule 3.3.
Prone; Rifle allowed for record firing: Service Rifle- Rule 3.1, 3.3.1 or 3.1.2; NRA Match Rifle, Rule 3.3; Any Rifle- Rule 3.2; Rule 3.3.4a: Palma Rifle -Rule 3.3.3; and "F-Class Prone"- Rule 5.6.1 NOTE: Palma Rifles will be allowed to shoot in the Match Rifle Category.

Scores: F class scores will be reported and used for NRA classification. F class cannot be combined with any other class and is not eligible for winning the Match in any conventional class or category.

Awards: Awards will be awarded in their individual class and categories.

Across The Course: NRA 800 Aggregate Courses

Match 1: 200 yards standing slow fire, 2 sighters and 20 shot for record with a time limit of 22 minutes. SR Target.

Match 2: 200 yards rapid fire, standing to sitting or kneeling, 2 sighters and 20 shots for record with a time limit of 60 seconds per string (two ten round strings) SR Target.

Match 3: 300 yards rapid fire, standing to prone, 2 sighters and 20 shots for record with a time limit of 70 seconds per string, (two ten shot strings) SR3 Target.

Match 4: 600-yard prone slow fire 2 sighters and 20 shot for record with a time limit of 22 minutes MR1 TARGET.

Match 5: Grand Aggregate of Matches 1, 2, 3, 4

Mid Range Prone Matches:

Match 1: 600 yard individual slow fire prone, Any/Any Rifle, Any Rifle Iron Sights, or F-class. Each shooter may fire unlimited sighters to hit the target. However, once the first round hit the target that will be the shooters first sighter for record. Shooters will score two sighters and 20 shots for record with a time limit of 22 minutes. There will be no additional time added for Match 1.

Match 2: 600 yard individual slow fire prone, Any Rifle, Iron Sights, or F-class. Each shooter will fire two sighters and 20 shots for record with a time limit of 22 minutes.

Match 3: 600 yard individual slow fire prone, Any Rifle, Iron Sights, or F-class. Each shooter will fire two sighters and 20 shots for record with a time limit of 22 minutes.

Match 4: Individual Aggregate of Matches 1, 2, & 3.

Team Matches:

NRA Across the Course:

Match 1: 200 yards standing slow fire, 2 sighters and 20 shot for record with a total team time of 97 minutes for an 800 Aggregate Team Match. National Match four man teams will receive 59 minutes per team. SR Target. **Note:** teams may fire pairs or singles with sighters and three minute preparation time for three competitors.

Match 2: 200 yards rapid fire, standing to sitting or kneeling, 2 sighters and 20 shots for record with a time limit of 60 seconds per string (two ten round strings) SR Target.

Match 3: 300 yards rapid fire, standing to prone, 2 sighters and 20 shots for record with a time limit of 70 seconds per string, (two ten shot strings) SR3 Target.

Match 4: 600-yard prone slow fire 2 sighters and 20 shot for record with a total team time of 97 minutes for an 800 Aggregate Team Match. National Match four man teams will receive 59 minutes per team. SR Target. **Note:** teams may fire pairs or singles with sighters and three minute preparation time for three competitors.

Match 5: Grand Aggregate of Matches 1, 2, 3, 4

Prone Matches: Four man team Match, 600 yard slow fire prone, Any/Any Rifle, Any Rifle Iron Sights, or F-class, 2 sighters and 20 shots for record per team member. There will be a 44 minute team time per two member phase, pit change between phases.

Matches and Match Dates:

Saturday, 18 October, Practice (200-600 yards): Firing will begin NLT 7:30 ARE. The Course of fire will be determined by consensus of the shooters. Caliber restrictions: .22-.30 Cal (center fire only)

Sunday, 19 October, National Trophy Infantry Team (NTIT) Match Practice: NTIT course of fire, pick-up teams **may** be available for individual shooters. Only Civilian Marksmanship Program and National Rifle Association approved rifles will be authorize to compete in this practice. National Rules apply. Firing will begin NLT 7:30 ARE.

Saturday, 1 November, Mid-Range Match: (3x600 yards prone): Firing will begin NLT 7:30 AM.

Saturday, 8 November, 800 Aggregate Match: (200-600 yards) Firing will begin NLT 7:30 AM.

Sunday, 9 November, National Trophy Infantry Team Match (Four Man Teams): Check-in starts at 7:00 AM and will be complete NLT 7:30 AM. Rifles allowed for record firing: Service Rifle- Rule 3.1, 3.3.1 or 3.1.2

Team Composition:

This course of fire has been modified to accommodate teams that consist of a captain, a coach and four members who fire for the team's score. Teams must have at least four firing members.

Course of Fire:

The Infantry Team Match Course of Fire (Table 6) is used for each team of four firing members.

(1) For firing at 600 and 500 yards, a standard 600-yard target is pasted on a standard competitive target frame. The face of the target is reversed to display a solid white background. The Army/Marine Corps "E" silhouette target is centered horizontally on this background, with the top of the silhouette 13" below the top of the frame. For firing at 300 and 200 yards, the Army/Marine Corps "D" silhouette target is pasted on the face of a standard 200-yard target, with the top of the silhouette positioned at the top of the 8 ring.

(2) Teams take their positions on the 600-yard firing line as directed by team officials. Only the captain, coach, and firing members are permitted on the line. A three-minute preparation period is given at the 600-yard firing line only. After the preparation period ends, the command "Load and be ready" is given and the targets are exposed between 10 seconds and no later than 40 seconds after this command. Shooters may start firing when targets appear. Between stages, each team moves forward abreast. Rifles must be unloaded, magazines removed and bolt opened, with muzzles elevated and

pointed down range. The firing procedures at each range are the same as those at 600 yards. Each relay must complete the match before the next relay is called.

Stage Distance Firing Position Time Limit:

- First 600 yards. Prone 50 sec.
- Second 500 yards. Prone, Sitting or Kneeling 50 sec.
- Third 300 yards. Sitting or Kneeling 50 sec.
- Fourth 200 yards. Standing 50 sec.

Competition Conditions:

- (1) **Slings:** A sling may be used for support in all positions.
- (2) **Ammunition:** Each team is permitted a total of 256 rounds of ammunition. The team captain will be called to the ammunition issue point and sign for his ammunition. Once all team on the relay have signed for their ammunition, they will return to their teams. The team captain allocates the ammunition among stages, divides it among the firing members and decides the number of rounds to be loaded in the clips or magazines. AT NO TIME WILL AMMUNITION OR MAGAZINES LEAVE THE FIRING POINT.
- (3) **Targets:** Each team is assigned a block of six adjoining targets. Gaps in the target line separate one team's targets from those of another.
- (4) **Coaching:** During the Infantry Team Match, both the team captain and the team coach may coach and talk directly with the shooters and they may touch the shooters' rifles.
- (5) **Malfunctions:** No alibis are accepted for misfires, disabled firearms or other failures of range or team equipment.
- (6) **Score Recording:** An assistant range officer is assigned to each team to enforce safety regulations and record the team's scores. A designated team representative (verifier) may accompany this officer down range to verify the score.

Scoring

- (1) All scores are recorded on the firing line at the end of each stage. Hits outside the silhouettes are not scored or marked.
- (2) Hits on the silhouettes count 4 points at 600 yards, 3 points at 500 yards, 2 points at 300 yards and 1 point at 200 yards.
- (3) A bonus for distribution is calculated at each range. The bonus is determined by counting the number of silhouette targets that contain six or more hits each. The number of targets with six or more hits is squared and that result is added to the total hit score for that range to produce the total score for that range.
- (4) Ties are broken by the highest team score at the longest range. When a tie cannot be broken this way, the highest team score at the next longest range is used, and so on.

Telescopes and Field Glasses:

In the National Trophy Infantry Team Match, the team captain and coach are permitted to use binoculars that do not exceed 10 X 50 in power and objective lens diameter. Telescopes may only be used behind the ready line and before the preparation period starts. Telescopes and field glasses may be used as follows:

- (1) The team captain and coach may use a telescope behind the assembly line for the purpose of reading the wind before the start of their team's relay. These telescopes may not be used for coaching or reading wind after the preparation period starts.
- (2) After the preparation period starts, the captain and coach may use binoculars that do not exceed 10 X 50 in power and objective lens diameter.
- (3) The assistant range officer or verifier may carry one telescope downrange and may use it only to check and verify scores.
- (4) Telescopes taken downrange must be turned parallel to the firing line during the time when targets are exposed and may be turned towards the targets only during scoring.

Equipment: Competitors must provide their own equipment (i.e., rifle with sling, ammunition, and hearing protection). Shooting gloves or mitts, jackets, mats, and spotting scopes are highly recommended. Hearing protection is mandatory; eye protection is highly recommended and encouraged. Open Bolt Indicators (OBI) or Chamber Flags are mandatory. (Limited quantities of OBI are available at the Stat Office for \$2.00 each)

Classifications: You must indicate on your enclosed entry form: Rifle: Service Rifle, Match Rifle, etc., your NRA number, NRA membership expiration date, and your highest classification achieved. All Unclassified shooters will be placed in the Master Class category per NRA rules. If you do not have a classification, but you are keeping a NRA, temporary record book, then the scores from the record book will be used to place you in a classification for that Match.

Scoring/Target Assignments: All competitors will be squadded by the Stats Officer or Match Director. Scorecards will be issued from the stat office at time of check-in. Scoring is a responsibility of the competitor; all competitors will score for each other (i.e., fourth relay scores for the first relay, first relay scores for second relay, etc.). All NRA rules and challenges apply. All challenges require a \$2.00 fee, which will be paid at the time of the challenge. If a challenge is met or corrected, the challenge fee will be returned to the competitor. See NRA rulebook for challenges. Scorecards will be complete, totaled, and signed before turning them in. Scorecards must be turned in to the Line Officer at the conclusion of each stage of fire. Failure to turn in a scorecard will result in disqualification for that stage.

Target Puller: If a competitor wishes to have a target puller, the competitor may provide one. It will be up to the competitor to handle all details related to the target puller. Competitors wishing a puller will bring all competitors to the stat office together for squadding.

Promotions/Awards: There must be five competitors in a category/classification. Less than five competitors will be promoted to the next higher classification, until a category/classification of five or greater is achieved. No competitor will be moved into the High Master classification. If these measures still result in fewer than five competitors in a category/classification, they will be eligible for Match winner awards only.

Entry Fees: Juniors and Unfunded Military in Uniform: \$15.00 Member: \$35.00
Daily Associate Member Fee: \$40.00
Military personnel on orders fees: \$35.00 (members) and \$40.00 (non-members)
Team Match Fees: \$10.00 per shooter and \$40.00 per team (4 man team) or \$60.00 for 6 man team.

*Fee includes NRA Registration, Range Fees, and Insurance

Practice Fees: Members, \$5.00 Daily Associate Member Fee, \$10.00

**RELEASE FROM RESPONSIBILITY, WAIVER OF LIABILITY AND ASSUMPTION OF RISK FOR PARTICIPATION IN
A DANGEROUS ACTIVITY**

FOR AND IN CONSIDERATION of permitting THE UNDERSIGNED to enter the MARINE CORPS BASE CAMP PENDLETON AND SANTA MARGARITA GUN CLUB, herein referred to as the "Santa Margarita Gun Club", premises for the purposes of firearms use, shooting of firearms, observing the shooting of firearms, or any and all other purposes, THE UNDERSIGNED, for himself/herself his/hers heirs, executors, administrators and assigns:

1. Hereby voluntarily releases, discharges, waives and relinquishes any and all actions or causes of action for personal injury, property damage or wrongful death occurring to the undersigned arising as a result of engaging in or being present at activities at the San Margarita Gun Club premises.

2. Hereby covenants not to sue and voluntarily releases, waives, discharges and relinquishes any action or causes of action, aforesaid, which may hereafter arise for himself/herself and for his/her heirs, executors, administrators and assigns prosecute or present any claim for personal injury, property damage or wrongful death against MCB, Camp Pendleton, CA, or the Santa Margarita Gun Club or any of its officers, agents, servants or employees for any of said causes of action, whether the same shall arise by negligence of any of said persons or otherwise. IT IS THE INTENTION OF THE UNDERSIGNED BY THIS INSTRUMENT, TO EXEMPT AND RELIEVE THE SANTA MARGARITA GUN CLUB OR ANY OF ITS' OFFICERS, AGENTS, SERVANTS OR EMPLOYEES; INCLUDING VOLUNTEERS, FROM LIABILITY FOR PERSONAL INJURY, PROPERTY DAMAGE OR WRONGFUL DEATH CAUSED BY NEGLIGENCE.

3. Agrees that in the event any claim for personal injury, property damage or wrongful death shall be prosecuted against the Santa Margarita Gun Club. The Undersigned shall indemnify and save harmless the same Santa Margarita Gun Club and any of its officers, agents, servants or employees, including volunteers, from any and claims or causes of action by whomever or wherever made or presented for personal injuries, property damage or wrongful death.

4. Agrees that the foregoing release is intended to be as broad and inclusive a permitted by the laws applicable in the State of California and that of any portion thereof is held invalid, it is agreed that the balance shall, notwithstanding, continue in full legal force and effect.

5. Acknowledges that the Undersigned has been fully and completely advised of the potential for serious accident incidental to engaging in firearms activities, including the potential for death, personal injury and property damage, and expressly agrees to assume all risks of loss, damage or injury that may be sustained by the Undersigned.

6. This agreement shall remain in effect until December 31, 2008, and cancels all previous agreements.

7. The Undersigned has read the foregoing paragraphs and voluntarily signs this agreement being fully aware of legal consequences of signing the within instrument.
