



Annual Camp Pendleton – Civilian Marksmanship Program Matches of 2011

The Santa Margarita Gun Club (SMGC) of Marine Corps Base, Camp Pendleton, California in conjunction with the Civilian Marksmanship Program is proud to sponsor a Excellence-in-Competition (Leg) Pistol Match, John C. Garand/Springfield/Vintage Military Rifle Match, .22 Caliber Rimfire Match, and a Excellence-in-Competition (Leg) Rifle Match.

Tournament Sponsor & Address: The tournament sponsor is the Santa Margarita Gun Club, Inc., P.O. Box 4858, Oceanside, CA 92052-4858.

Tournament Dates:

Saturday, Jun 25, 2011 –Garand/Springfield/Vintage Military Rifle Match, Excellence-in-Competition (Leg) Pistol Match, and .22 Caliber Rimfire Match
Sunday, Jun 26, 2011 – Excellence-in-Competition (Leg) Rifle Match

Range Location: Wilcox Range Complex (Ranges 102/103), Marine Corps Base, Camp Pendleton, CA. Refer to Club web-site for Directions to Ranges 102/103, and vehicle entry requirements to Camp Pendleton, CA.

Range Facilities: There are no food or drink facilities, it is highly recommended that you bring bottled drinks (non-alcoholic) and/or non-perishable food items. Alcoholic beverages are not permitted on or in the general vicinity of the firing lines. Smoking is prohibited on the range due to fire hazard. Sanitary facilities are of the “Port-a-Potty” variety.

Rules: These matches will be conducted in accordance with the CMP Competition Rules which are in effect on the tournament commencement date.

Eligibility: These matches are open to all citizens and legal residents of the United States of America. Citizens of foreign nations may enter these matches upon proof of legal entry into the USA (validated passport and/or visa). Membership in the Civilian Marksmanship Program, National Rifle Association, California Rifle & Pistol Association, or the Santa Margarita Gun Club is not required.

Those persons who cannot legally participate in the shooting sports or who are barred from entry onto a federal military reservation are not eligible to participate in these matches.

Entries: A limit of 30 entries will be accepted for each of the events.

Entry into these matches can be made by completing the attached Match Entry Registration Form, CMP Affidavit and Liability Release and the Santa Margarita Gun Club Liability Release. Completed entry forms may be mailed to the Tournament Sponsor’s address.

E-mail intentions to enter will be accepted. The E-mail must contain the Competitor’s Name , Home Address, a Contact Telephone Number, Matches to be entered, Type of Rifle using, , and State Driver’s License with expiration date.

Entries Close: Entries should be received not later than close of normal business hours on the Tuesday preceding the Match. Entries received after Tuesday will be honored however entry onto Camp Pendleton can not be assured.

Security Regulations for MCB, Camp Pendleton require that the match sponsor (the SMGC) notify the appropriate Base agency of Non-DoD persons participating in the Match on the Wednesday preceding the matches. This notification is generated by the received match entry forms and intention to enter messages..

“Walk-In” entries may be accepted up to one hour before the start of the first scheduled match, if squadding permits and payment of the Late Fee.

Note: CMP Registration Fee of \$10.00 is included in each EIC match registration fee.

Check-In Procedures. The Statistical Office will be open from 6:30 to 7:15 AM daily. Competitors must report to the Match Statistical Office for administrative processing before going to the firing line. The Statistical Office will also be open between events for registration purposes. Competitors participating in more than one event during the same day may pre-register for that event. A notary public will be available for shooters to complete the CMP Affidavit, if needed



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- EIC Rifle or Pistol Matches. Alibis and/or Refires will be allowed in accordance with appropriate National Rifle Association rules
- GSM or .22 Cal Rimfire Matches. No Alibis or Refires will be allowed for ammunition or weapon malfunction. Individual Range Officer Alibis may be allowed.

Ammunition: All shooters will be responsible for providing their own ammunition. Ammunition must conform to CMP standards (Rule 6.8).

Armor-Piercing, Tracer, or Incendiary Ammunition is Prohibited.

Equipment

- **Safety** – Hearing, Eye Protection, and Empty Chamber Indicators (ECI) or Chamber Flags are Mandatory
- **Spotting Scopes (Binoculars)** - Shooters may use spotting scopes or binoculars is allowed.
- **Other Equipment** – Cloth, canvas or leather shooting jackets may be used. Standard military issue web or leather slings or slings of this same type are permitted. Shooting gloves or mitts and ground cloths or shooting mats may be used.

Disqualification: If a shooter is disqualified, his/her score will be stricken from the records, all fees paid will be forfeit, and they will be listed on the Official Match Bulletin as "Disqualified." Disqualification procedures including right of appeal will be adhered to as outlined in CMP Rules 5.10, 5.11, and 5.12.

Garand - Springfield - Military Vintage Rifle Match Information

Squadding: Upon completion of check-in processing, all shooters will proceed to the 200 yard line so as to arrive there not later than 07:30 AM. All shooters must attend a mandated range safety and environmental briefing. Target and relay assignments will be accomplished after the safety and environmental briefing.

Weapons Allowed: Most GSM competitors use the M1 Garand Rifle but shooters may also use the M1903 or M1903A3 Springfield, M1917 Enfield, M1941 Johnson, U.S. Krag Rifles, U.S. M1 Carbine or Foreign Military Bolt Action Rifles. All rifles must be "as-issued" condition for general military use and comply with CMP Rule 6.2 as appropriate. No specialty rifles such as Sniper Versions, rifles modified for target shooting, or with National Match parts other than an M-1 with NM Operating Rod, will be allowed.

Match Start Time: 8:00 AM, Saturday, June 25, 2011

Target Pullers: All competitors will take turns performing this service. The SMGC does not provide target pullers.

Course of Fire:

The GSM Rifle Match can be completed by both new and experienced shooters as both will find it uniquely challenging. All firing is from 200 yards. The first portion (or stage) starts with five (5) sighter or practice shoots followed by ten (10) shots for record from the prone position in 15 minutes. The second stage is where the shooter shoots 10 rounds for record in 80 seconds from the prone position. The third or final stage is where the shooter shoots 10 rounds for record from the off-hand standing position in 10 minutes.

John C. Garand Match Course "A" (Rule 9.2.1). All firing is at 200 yards on the standard Short Range (SR) High Power Rifle Target.

- First Stage - Slow Fire, Prone Position. A maximum of (5) sighter shots and 10 record shots in 15 minutes.
- Second Stage - Rapid Fire, From Standing to Prone Position. 10 record shots in 80 seconds
- Third Stage - Slow Fire, Standing Position. 10 record shots in 10 minutes.

Alibis: No alibis or refires will be allowed because of rifle or ammunition malfunction during any stage of this match. It is important that the rifle you use is clean, properly lubricated, and in good working order.

Awards: Shooters who fire qualifying scores will receive Gold, Silver, or Bronze Achievement Pins. The qualifying scores are listed in the current edition of the CMP Competition Rules Handbook.

Rifle Inspections: All rifles used in the GSM Rifle Matches must be "as issued" military service rifle that complies with CMP Rule 6.2.4 or 6.2.5. At the conclusion of each relay, rifles may be selected by random draw for inspection and trigger weighing.



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Excellence-In-Arms (Leg) Pistol Match

Squadding: Upon completion of check-in processing or the preceding event, all shooters will report to Pistol Range Tower, Range 102 no later than 10:15 AM. All shooters must attend a mandated range safety and environmental briefing. Target and relay assignments will be accomplished after the safety and environmental briefing.

Weapons Allowed: U.S. Pistol, Caliber .45, M1911/M1911A1, or U.S. Pistol, 9mm, M9. These pistols must be of the type issued by the U.S. Armed Forces or a commercial pistol of the same type and caliber subject to the specific requirements denoted in CMP Rule 6.6.

Match Start Time: 10:30 AM, Saturday, June 25, 2011

Sighter Shots: None

Course of Fire:

- First Stage - 50 Yards, Slow Fire, 10 Shots, Two 5-Round strings within 10 minute time limit.
- Second Stage - 25 Yards, Timed Fire, 10 Shots, Two 5-Round strings each fired with a 20 second time limit.
- Third Stage - 25 Yards, Rapid Fire, 10 Shots, Two 5-Round strings each fired with a 10 second time limit.

- **Alibis:** Alibis/Refires will be in accordance with current NRA Rules for National Match Course, Outdoor Pistol.

Awards: Shooters who finish in the top 10% of those entered will receive points towards the Distinguished Pistol Shot Badge. The CMP will award these points in accordance with the current edition of the CMP Competition Rules Handbook.

Pistol Inspections: All Pistols used in the EIC Pistol Match must comply with CMP Rules. At the conclusion of each relay, pistols may be selected by random draw for inspection and trigger weighing.

.22 Caliber Rimfire Match Information

Squadding: Upon completion of administrative processing or the preceding event, all shooters will report to 100 Yard Line of Range 103, Assembly Area not later than 12:30 PM to attend a mandated range safety and environmental briefing and receive their relay and firing point information.

Weapons Allowed: Semi-Automatic, Bolt Action, Pump, or Lever-Action rifles chambered for .22 Caliber Long Rifle Rimfire Cartridge. Rifles may be single shot, magazine or tube fed. Sights may be open, telescopic, or receiver (aperture). Weight of the rifle not to exceed 7 ½ pounds

Rifles especially designed for target (match) shooting or with thumbhole stocks, adjustable butt plates, adjustable cheek pieces and rails, adjustable (moveable) sling swivels are NOT permitted.

Sights: Rifles are to be divided into two classes, Open Sight and Telescopic/Receiver.

Telescopic/Receiver: Rifles equipped with telescopes or receiver (aperture) sights will compete in the T-Class. Telescopes can not exceed 6 power (6X). Variable power scopes must be taped down not to exceed 6X.

Open: Rifle equipped with V, U, or Notch type sights will compete in the O-Class.

Equipment: Hearing and eye protection is mandatory, Spotting Scores or Binoculars, Shooting Mats, and gloves (work or dress) may be used.

- Specialized accessories (such as Shooting Jackets, Shooting Trousers (pants), Shooting Gloves, Padded Mitts, etc.) are not permitted.

Course of Fire

CMP Rimfire Sporter Course of Fire

- Stage 1 - Slow Fire, 50 Yards, Prone Position, Unlimited Number of Sighter Shots, 10 Minute Time Limit.
- Stage 2 - Slow Fire, 50 Yards, Prone Position, Ten (10) Record Shots, 10 Minute Time Limit.
- Stage 3 - Rapid Fire, 50 Yards, Standing to Prone Position, Ten (10) Record Shots (2 Series of 5 rounds), Time Limit of 25 Seconds for Semi-Automatic Rifles, all others 30 Seconds.
- Stage 4 - Slow Fire, 50 Yards, Sitting or Kneeling Position, Ten (10) Record Shots, 10 Minute Time Limit.
- Stage 5 - Rapid Fire, 50 Yards, Standing to Sitting or Kneeling Position, Ten (10) Record Shots (2 Series of 5 rounds), Time Limit of 25 Seconds for Semi-Automatic Rifles, all others 30 Seconds.
- Stage 6 - Slow Fire, 25 Yards, Standing Position, Ten (10) Record Shots, 10 Minute Time Limit.
- Stage 7 - Rapid Fire, 25 Yards, Standing Position, Ten (10) Record Shots (2 Series of 5 rounds), Time Limit of 25 Seconds for Semi-Automatic Rifles, all others 30 Seconds.

Alibis or Refires: No alibis or refires will be allowed because of rifle or ammunition malfunction during any stage of this match. It is important that the rifle you use is clean, properly lubricated, and in good working order.

Awards: Shooters who fire qualifying scores will receive Gold, Silver, or Bronze Achievement Pins. The qualifying scores are listed in the current edition of the CMP Rimfire Rules Handbook.

Rifle Inspections: All rifles used in the .22 Caliber Rimfire Match must comply with CMP Rimfire Match Rules. At the conclusion of each relay, rifles may be selected by random draw for inspection and trigger weighing.

Excellence-In-Arms (Leg) Rifle Match

Squadding: Upon completion of check-in processing, all shooters will report to the Assembly Area for Target 100, Range 103 no later than 07:30 AM. All shooters must attend a mandated range safety and environmental briefing. Target and relay assignments will be accomplished after the safety and environmental briefing.

Weapons Allowed: U.S. Rifle, Caliber .30, M1; U.S. Rifle, Caliber 7.62mm, M14, or U.S. Rifle, Caliber 5.56mm, M16. These rifles must be of the type issued by the U.S. Armed Forces or a commercial rifle of the same type and caliber subject to the specific requirements denoted in CMP Rule 6.2.

Match Start Time: 08:00 AM, Sunday, June 26, 2011

Sighter Shots: None

Course of Fire:

- First Stage - 200 Yards, Slow Fire, Standing, 10 Shots with a 10 minute time limit.
- Second Stage - 200 Yards, Rapid Fire, Sitting or Kneeling from Standing, 10 Shots fired within a 60 second time limit.
- Third Stage - 300 Yards, Rapid Fire, Prone from Standing, 10 Shots fired within a 70 second time limit
- Fourth Stage - 600 Yards, Slow Fire, Prone, 10 Shots with a 10 minute time limit.

Alibis: Alibis/Refires will be in accordance with current NRA Rules for National Match Course, High Power Rifle.

Awards: Shooters who finish in the top 10% of those entered will receive points towards the Distinguished Marksmanship Badge. The CMP will award these points in accordance with the current edition of the CMP Competition Rules Handbook.

Rifle Inspections: All Rifles used in the EIC Rifle Match must comply with CMP Rules. At the conclusion of each relay, rifles may be selected by random draw for inspection and trigger weighing.

RELEASE FROM RESPONSIBILITY, WAIVER OF LIABILITY AND ASSUMPTION OF RISK FOR PARTICIPATION IN A
DANGEROUS ACTIVITY

FOR AND IN CONSIDERATION of permitting THE UNDERSIGNED to enter the MARINE CORPS BASE CAMP PENDLETON AND SANTA MARGARITA GUN CLUB, herein referred to as the "Santa Margarita Gun Club", premises for the purposes of firearms use, shooting of firearms, observing the shooting of firearms, or any and all other purposes, THE UNDERSIGNED, for himself/herself his/hers heirs, executors, administrators and assigns:

1. Hereby voluntarily releases, discharges, waives and relinquishes any and all actions or causes of action for personal injury, property damage or wrongful death occurring to the undersigned arising as a result of engaging in or being present at activities at the San Margarita Gun Club premises.
2. Hereby covenants not to sue and voluntarily releases, waives, discharges and relinquishes any action or causes of action, aforesaid, which may hereafter arise for himself/herself and for his/her heirs, executors, administrators and assigns prosecute or present any claim for personal injury, property damage or wrongful death against MCB, Camp Pendleton, CA, or the Santa Margarita Gun Club or any of its officers, agents, servants or employees for any of said causes of action, whether the same shall arise by negligence of any of said persons or otherwise. IT IS THE INTENTION OF THE UNDERSIGNED BY THIS INSTRUMENT, TO EXEMPT AND RELIEVE THE SANTA MARGARITA GUN CLUB OR ANY OF ITS' OFFICERS, AGENTS, SERVANTS OR EMPLOYEES; INCLUDING VOLUNTEERS, FROM LIABILITY FOR PERSONAL INJURY, PROPERTY DAMAGE OR WRONGFUL DEATH CAUSED BY NEGLIGENCE.
3. Agrees that in the event any claim for personal injury, property damage or wrongful death shall be prosecuted against the Santa Margarita Gun Club. The Undersigned shall indemnify and save harmless the same Santa Margarita Gun Club and any of its officers, agents, servants or employees, including volunteers, from any and claims or causes of action by whomever or wherever made or presented for personal injuries, property damage or wrongful death.
4. Agrees that the foregoing release is intended to be as broad and inclusive a permitted by the laws applicable in the State of California and that of any portion thereof is held invalid, it is agreed that the balance shall, notwithstanding, continue in full legal force and effect.

Acknowledges that the Undersigned has been fully and completely advised of the potential for serious accident incidental to engaging in firearms activities, including the potential for death, personal injury and property damage, and expressly agrees to assume all risks of loss, damage or injury that may be sustained by the Undersigned.
6. This agreement supersedes all previous agreements and shall remain in force until December 31, 2011
