Service Pistol & .22 Cal Rimfire Pistol Matches
Excellence in Competition (EIC) Match Program
Tournament Program

The Santa Margarita Gun Club (SMGC) on Marine Corps Base Camp Pendleton, California in conjunction with the Civilian Marksmanship Program (CMP) is proud to sponsor the following matches.

1. **TOURNAMENT DATE:** Sunday, January 26, 2020
CMP Excellence–in–Competition Pistol EIC (Leg) Match and CMP Excellence–in–Competition .22 Caliber Pistol EIC (Leg) Match
2. **SPONSORING ORGANIZATION:** Santa Margarita Gun Club, Inc. Refer to SMGC web-site www.smgunclub.org for Camp Pendleton vehicle entry requirements and detailed driving directions to the range.
3. **PISTOL RANGE LOCATION:** Range 213 & 214, Horno Range Complex, MCB Camp Pendleton, CA.
4. **RANGE FACILITIES:** Range 213 is a 25 Yard, 40-point Pistol firing range. Range 214 is adjacent to Range 213 and is where the 50 Yard portion will be conducted. Sanitary facilities are of the “Port-a-Potty” variety. There are no food or drink facilities. It is **highly recommended that you bring bottled drinks (non-alcoholic) and/or non-perishable food items.** Alcoholic beverages are not permitted on or in the general vicinity of the firing lines, while live fire is being conducted.
5. **RULES:** Current CMP Rules for the EIC Matches will apply.
6. **COMPETITION OPEN TO - ELIGIBILITY:** These matches are open to all citizens and legal residents of the United States of America. **You must be a US citizen or Green Card holder to access Marine Corps Base Camp Pendleton.** Membership in the Civilian Marksmanship Program or California Rifle & Pistol Association is not required; however, Membership in the Santa Margarita Gun Club is required. Those persons who cannot legally participate in the shooting sports or who cannot enter a federal military reservation are not eligible to participate in this tournament.
7. **REGISTRATION & FEES:** Registration: All registration will be done through **PRACTISCORE**. You will need to setup an account (which is free) to register and make payments.

Registration Closes on Thursday, January 16.

Fees (per Match): Military \$20, SMGC Annual Member \$30, Daily SMGC Member \$50. Fees will be collected thru Practiscore at the time of registration. For instance: If you are military and shooting a single match you will be charged \$20. If you are military firing both matches (Service & .22 Caliber), you will be charged \$40.

All competitors are required to be SMGC Members due to USMC range usage agreements and Insurance Restrictions. If you are not an annual SMGC member, an assessment fee is included for Daily SMGC Membership in the entry fee. SMGC Membership is open to all Active Duty Members, Reserve Members and Retirees of the United States Armed Forces. Annual SMGC Civilian Memberships are dependent upon the number of Current Military members of the Club, according to the club’s By Laws. **You will be required to go to the Visitors Center on base Thursday or Friday preceding the match to obtain your base access pass.**

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8. **ENTRIES - Electronic:** **ALL ENTRIES ARE REQUIRED IN ADVANCE** -The deadline for registration entries for non-SMGC members is Thursday, **January 16th**. All Entries AFTER this date are considered to be LATE and will NOT be able to enter the Matches. Electronic Entries are necessary to ensure Names are provided to the Base Security Office by the close of business on the Friday one week prior to the event, so those persons may be vetted. Current Military Members and Current Annual SMGC members can register thru 9 PM Thursday, January 23.
9. ***MCB Camp Pendleton Security Regulations require the match sponsor (SMGC) notify the appropriate Base agency of Non Department of Defense (DoD) persons participation.*** This notification is generated by the received match entry forms and intention to enter messages. Therefore entry onto MCB Camp Pendleton may be denied to those persons who do not indicate their intent to participate or observe using the electronic Match Registration form. Additionally, persons who have expired driver's licenses will not be granted entry onto Camp Pendleton. Registration match forms must also be completed in their entirety. Failure to complete the information section and NRA Membership Number section of the registration form may lead to the inability to correctly report classification to the NRA and CMP.
10. **ENTRY LIMIT:** 40 Individual Entries. **There must be at least six non-distinguished shooters to award any Leg points. Non-Distinguished shooters will get the priority to shoot.** These matches will be conducted in two relays to allow competitors to fire both pistol matches and/or share equipment with another shooter.
11. **START TIME:** **7:30 AM on Sunday.** Muster and check in will go at the Range 213 parking lot. We want all shooters to be in the parking area and checked in at 7:30 AM so that we can conduct our Range Safety Brief and squad the match.

GENERAL INFORMATION:

12. **CHECK-IN PROCEDURES:**

All competitors must check in at the Match Statistical Office for administrative processing. The Statistical Office (Range213) will be open from **7:00 AM to 7:30 AM** on Sunday morning of the Pistol EIC Tournament.

Competitors are required to complete administrative processing, ensure payment of tournament fees, and receive their squadding assignments before they can participate.

13. **MANDATORY RANGE SAFETY & ENVIRONMENTAL BRIEFING:**

After completion of administrative processing, report to the designated yard line not later than **7:30 AM**. Prior to the Matches all competitors must attend the mandated range safety and environmental briefing. **Competitors not attending the mandated briefing will not be allowed to compete.** Entry fees will be refunded less a \$10.00 processing charge.

14. **COMPETITOR PARKING AREAS:** (*Range 213*) - Competitor parking is permitted in the designated paved parking lot behind the Pistol Range. All competitors are required to park their vehicles in this parking lot to the rear of the range. **NO overnight competitor parking maybe permitted in the parking lot.**

15. **SAFETY EQUIPMENT:** Hearing Protection, Eye Protection, and Empty Chamber Indicators (ECI) are **mandatory**. ECI's may be purchased at the range for a cost of \$ 2.00.

16. **AMMUNITION:** Competitors must supply their own factory ammunition. Service Pistol competitors may use any safe ammunition that is loaded with metal-jacketed or metal-plated bullets. Non-Jacketed Wad Cutter, Lead Bullets. (CMP Rule 4.4.1 applies). Rimfire Pistol competitors may use only 22 cal. rimfire long rifle ammunition with bullets weighing not more than 40 grains. (CMP Rule 4.4.2 applies). Tracer, incendiary or armor piercing ammunition is prohibited (NRA Rule 3.17 (c) applies).

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17. **SIGHTING SHOTS:** There will be no sighting shots allowed for each authorized Match. Refer to the Courses of Fire section.
18. **SCORING SHOTS:** Competitor will score each other's targets. Competitor will score each other's targets. Competitors will score the shooters shots and place the value of the shot on the other Competitor's score card. Competitors will score in the following manner; Odd number Targets will score the target to their right, Even number Targets will score the target to their left. Place the value of the shot on the other Competitor's score card. Challenges will be addressed and confirmed by the competitors at the time of scoring.
19. **CHALLENGES:** A fee of \$2.00 is required and payable upon requesting the challenge. If the challenge is denied, the fee will be forfeit.
20. **CHALLENGE PERIOD:** The challenge period will end ½ hour after the posting of the last match results.
21. **RULES:** Current Civilian Marksmanship Program (CMP) Rules will apply. See the current edition of the CMP Competition Rulebooks: <http://thecmp.org/competitions/cmp-competitions-rulebooks/>

22. **PISTOL TYPES ALLOWED:** Approved U. S. Service Pistols and Commercial Equivalent

(2020 CMP Rules 4.1.1; 4.1.2.;4.1.3 (a) (b) (c); and 4.1.4 will apply)

The following U. S. Government Service Pistols or commercial versions of the same type and caliber may be used in CMP-sanctioned Service Pistol Matches, provided they comply with Rules 4.1.1 and 4.1.2.

Rimfire Pistols (CMP Rule 4.1.6 22 applies)

No scoped pistols will be used during any of the EIC matches. Pistols that exceed their appropriate NRA specifications will be disqualified; scores fired disallowed, and match fees forfeit. It is the Competitors responsibility to ensure your firearm is in compliance with the CMP rulebook prior to arrival at the match site.

23. **SIGHTS:** Metallic, Service (CMP Rule 6.3 applies) sights are allowed. Service Pistols using sights other than metallic will not be allowed.
24. **ALIBIS:** Alibis/Re-fires will be in accordance with current CMP Outdoor Pistol Rules.
25. **EIC AWARDS:** Shooters who finish in the top 10% of those entered will receive points towards the Distinguished Pistol Shot Badge. The CMP will award these points in accordance with the current edition of the CMP Competition Rules Handbook. Official recognition of the Match Winners and the top 10 % of competitors will be recorded in the Tournament Results Bulletin. Gold, Silver & Bronze Place Medals will be presented to the top three competitors (Distinguished or Non-Distinguished). Gold, Silver & Bronze Achievement Pins will be presented to competitors, by the sponsoring club, after the event (Distinguished or Non-Distinguished), in CMP Sanctioned EIC Matches, that equal or exceed Achievement Award Scores. Points – Points are given to any non-distinguished shooters who place in the top ten percent of non-distinguished shooters, provided that the score fired by the competitor equals or exceeds the EIC Minimum Credit Score. All Points are issued by the CMP.

Minimum EIC Scores – To receive EIC credit points, the score fired by the competitor must equal or exceed the EIC Minimum Credit Score (MCS) for that discipline.

- MCS scores for are:
- Service Pistol. 250 out of a possible 300
 - .22 Caliber Rimfire Pistol. 260 out of a possible 300

26. **PISTOL INSPECTIONS:** All Pistols used in the EIC Pistol Match must comply with CMP Rules. At the conclusion of each relay, pistols may be selected by random draw for inspection and trigger weighing.

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27. **Course of Fire:** COF for Service Pistol EIC and .22 Rimfire EIC Pistol is the 30 shot National Match Course of Fire.

NOTE: The match will be conducted in the following manner:

R214 - 50 Yard Slow Fire Only:

Relay 1 and Relay 2 – 50 yards Slow Fire (Service Pistol and .22 Caliber Rimfire)

Move to R213, to conduct the Timed and Rapid fire matches on R213

Relay 1 and Relay 2 - 25 yard Timed Fire (Service Pistol and .22 Caliber Rimfire)

Relay 2 and Relay 2 - 25 yard Rapid Fire (Service Pistol and .22 Caliber Rimfire)

Competitors may fire either Service Pistol EIC or 22Rimfire EIC or both matches.

28. **TRANSPORTATION OF WEAPONS:** ALL Competitors are reminded that they must comply with California State Law in the transportation of weapons to and from the ranges aboard MCB Camp Pendleton

1. Hereby voluntarily releases, discharges, waives and relinquishes any and all actions or causes of action for personal injury, property damage or wrongful death occurring to the undersigned arising as a result of engaging in or being present at activities at the San Margarita Gun Club premises.
2. Hereby covenants not to sue and voluntarily releases, waives, discharges and relinquishes any action or causes of action, aforesaid, which may hereafter arise for himself/herself and for his/her heirs, executors, administrators and assigns prosecute or present any claim for personal injury, property damage or wrongful death against MCB, Camp Pendleton, CA, or the Santa Margarita Gun Club or any of its officers, agents, servants or employees for any of said causes of action, whether the same shall arise by negligence of any of said persons or otherwise. IT IS THE INTENTION OF THE UNDERSIGNED BY THIS INSTRUMENT, TO EXEMPT AND RELIEVE THE SANTA MARGARITA GUN CLUB OR ANY OF ITS' OFFICERS, AGENTS, SERVANTS OR EMPLOYEES; INCLUDING VOLUNTEERS, FROM LIABILITY FOR PERSONAL INJURY, PROPERTY DAMAGE OR WRONGFUL DEATH CAUSED BY NEGLIGENCE.
3. Agrees that in the event any claim for personal injury, property damage or wrongful death shall be prosecuted against the Santa Margarita Gun Club.
